









Creating new habitat connections in the Yarra Valley

Yarra4Life is a major environmental project in the Yarra Valley that aims to protect, improve, increase and connect habitat for native animals, including the Helmeted Honeyeater and the Leadbeater's Possum.

A long-term goal is to create habitat links from the Yellingbo Nature Conservation Reserve the Yarra Ranges National Park in the north, Kurth Kiln Regional Park in the south-east and the Dandenong Ranges National Park in the west. These connections would expand the habitat range for threatened native animal species.

2016-17 was the fourth year of this five-year, \$1 million project funded by the Australian Government's National Landcare Program.

Looking forward

2017-18 will see the completion of the five-year \$1 million project funded by the Australian Government's National Landcare Program. This will include:

- the delivery of on-ground works funded through round two of the private land incentives program
- the completion of a multi-year project at Coranderrk Estate
- the delivery of a deer control and monitoring program in Yellingbo Nature Conservation Reserve
- the restoration of the 2.3 hectare block of land purchased to expand the Yellingbo Nature Conservation Reserve.

Yarra4Life will also be rolling out a series of education and training programs in partnership with the Yarra Ranges Council. The Yarra4Life Coordination Committee will develop a new five-year strategic plan and annual business plan and review their communications plan.
