Properties that are primary producers are not eligible for this grant.	approved weed control works: Purchasing herbicide (maximum \$250, or \$500 for community groups). Disposing of weed material, i.e. tip passes or skip hire (maximum \$200). Hiring of equipment, for example sprayers, mulchers etc (maximum \$250).
